Alleluia, Christ is risen! He is risen indeed, alleluia!

Easter is the most important festival of the church year. We have concluded our Lenten and Holy Week spiritual journey, remembering all Jesus commanded us to do and His sacrifice for our salvation. Now, we rejoice with Christ in His resurrection and look forward to the fulfillment of His promise to each of us: that we will be raised to new and eternal life.

The music of Easter is powerful, majestic, and celebratory; I love all of it and I look forward to sharing the music for the Easter season each year. We can all name our favorite Easter hymns and be able to express the joy they bring to us when we sing them. I would like to briefly comment on an Easter canticle I have found particularly meaningful: "Worthy is Christ" or sometimes it is called "This is the Feast." You may not think of this hymn as necessarily Easter music. It is frequently sung during the gathering rites of the service, especially on Sundays when communion is celebrated. As a reminder, the text for this canticle is as follows:

This is the feast of victory for our God. Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.

Worthy is Christ the Lamb who was slain, whose blood set us free to be people of God.

Power, riches, wisdom, and strength, and honor, blessing, and glory are His.

Sing with all the people of God, and join in the hymn of all creation:

Blessing, honor, glory, and might be to God and the Lamb forever. Amen.

For the Lamb who was slain has begun his reign. Alleluia.

This text, which embodies the message of Easter, was written by John W. Arthur, and is based on Revelation 5:12-14. This canticle first appeared in the Lutheran Book of Worship (The Green Hymnal) in 1978 and has been a part of the Lutheran liturgy ever since. I remember how this canticle made such a strong impression on me when I first heard it while visiting a Lutheran church in Wisconsin many years ago. I am looking forward to once again proclaiming Christ's victory over sin and death as we sing this joyous canticle during the Easter season.

May you have a blessed Fifty Days of Easter!

Funeral Receptions

The Fellowship Committee has been asked to be in charge of setting up, serving and clean up for funeral/memorial receptions. Since all of the Fellowship Committee's activities involve serving food and/or beverages and working in the kitchen, it has been decided that that this committee will also be responsible for organizing the crews that will be in charge of the funeral receptions.

Prior to Covid, we would sign up for a time when we were available to work at funerals receptions and/or bake for funeral receptions. We would like to resume that practice. The sign-up sheets for funeral reception helpers will be on a table in Fellowship Hall for the first three weeks of April, 2024. You will be able to sign up to serve for the next six months, May through October. Next October, we will put out sign-up sheets for the six months of November through April so that snowbirds will have a chance to volunteer to help out with funeral receptions for the winter & spring season.

The only time that you may be asked to provide baked goods is when the family prefers a small reception which does not involve a caterer. Please appreciate that even though you may read about one of our church members passing away, many of us choose to have the funeral and reception back in our "home" state so we do have months where there are no receptions as well as months where there are several funerals and receptions. In months when there are no receptions here at ALC, you will not be called to serve.

In Our Prayers

Yet so that we can maintain an accurate and manageable prayer list for corporate worship and community life, the following 'prayer protocols' have been put into place.

A **prayer list 'booklet'** will be updated regularly and can be picked up in the narthex. This list includes those in hospice care or facing long-term challenges. Their names will remain on our prayer list until their personal circumstances change. The grieving and those who have died since the last All Saints Day will also remain on the list until we celebrate all the saints again in the fall. Members in need of healing, and family and friends for whom prayer requests have been made, will remain on the list for 3 weeks unless we are notified otherwise. These individuals will be contacted before their name is removed. For reasons of confidentiality, details of an individual's struggles can not be disclosed. During <u>corporate worship</u>, which is accessible to all through the world wide web, those individuals in hospice care and those on our 3-week cycle of prayer updates will be included in our intercessions.

We thank you for your patient understanding as we make the adjustments and adaptations called for in this day and age. If you have any questions or concerns please feel free to contact Pastor Julia.
