
Working as a team with both new and continuing leaders, what follows are a few of the things I hope happen in 2024.

ALC Stephen Ministers wish each of our ALC members a very Happy New Year. It is always exciting to start a new year, and while we do not make new years resolutions as such, we do reexamine our goals for each of our Care Receivers, and for our Stephen Ministry outreach here at ALC. Did you know that ALC has been a Stephen Ministry Congregation since 1982 with our first group of Stephen Ministers being commissioned and meeting with their Care Receivers in 1984? We have one of the longest, continuously functioning Stephen Ministry programs in the world. Currently 69 of our members are trained Stephen Ministers; 36 remain active while others have retired; and some former Stephen Ministers now have a Stephen Minister. ALC's Stephen Ministry program has been recognized by Stephen Ministry world headquarters in St. Louis, Missouri as a model program.

You might ask how one becomes a Stephen Minister, and the answer is by completing our Stephen Ministry Training and making a two year commitment to the ALC Stephen Ministry program. Today more than 600,000 men and women have been trained and commissioned in their home congregations world wide. Wouldn't you like to be among that number?

The annual Stephen Ministry Training at ALC occurs January thru March of each year, and we are blessed once again to have enough interested members to conduct our training sessions in 2024. This year our classes will begin on Jan. 12th. God has given each of us unique talents. If yours might be extending a caring presence to someone in need, our Stephen Ministry Training will equip you to do so effectively and comfortably. Will you consider joining us in this important part of ALC's Care Ministry? We still have room and can accommodate several more potential care givers. Gratitude Moments The Ministry Behind Communion



I never really understood all the work that went behind giving communion. I just never really thought much about it. I assumed someone put the wafers and wine out and thought that was that! My goodness, was I ever wrong. I found this out after I first volunteered with the Altar Guild. You know, the people who work behind the scenes might, just might...be saints!

Do you realize all the work that this ministry does? They are cleaning and dusting the altar and communion rails, preparing the altar with the elements before and after each service, preparing the cups with wine and juice as well as the hosts/wafers for each service and inbetween services. They prepare the collection buckets and put them out. They are responsible for preparing the Pew Minister trays and have to clean up after each service. They work with the head usher of each service, who leaves a "count" for them so they can prepare enough wine and hosts for each service. In addition, they also have a "delegate(s)" who is responsible for cleaning and putting on the correct paraments for each church season. (There are approximately 12 parament changes in the church calendar year.) In addition to all of these tasks they also launder towels and cloths they use. Whew! These "volunteers" are often not recognized and not thanked. You will see them after each service cleaning and preparing for the next service. Stop and let them know you appreciate their work. Ever since the pandemic, it has been harder to get volunteers for this ministry. Many of the volunteers are snowbirds so they can't volunteer during the summer, and everyone needs to take a vacation at some point. Whether you are a snowbird or not, if this ministry is of interest to you, call Dr. James Gerber. He will be happy to add you to the list of volunteers. We work as a TEAM so you are never alone, and there is a designated leader, which I like, so I can just follow. Come check us out!

As you can see, it's volunteers and donations that make this place successful. This is your chance to be a part of something awesome and actually keep a New Year's resolution. WIN/WIN.





Gifts and Memorials Annual Report January 2024

This committee was formed in April 2019 to work in conjunction with the Trusts Committee for the dispersal of monies donated as gifts or memorials. As a committee we oversee the dispersal of funds donated to us for use in all the ministries of ALC. We report monthly to Trusts and our Church Council

This year we were blessed with a substantial undesignated memorial gift from a long-time member. We discussed with Trusts, our Treasurer, the Finance committee and Pastor Klimke how to best use this gift for ALC. After a number of meetings a plan developed and has been put in place. We now have a separate "Savings" account with Morgan Stanley earning good interest and also some managed funds for growth. This account was divided into separate "buckets" for use as needed when budget funds run low. Two reserve funds were established, a Liquid Operating Fund and Liquid Capital Reserve.
