

Twenty years ago, I was asked to consider a call to a Native Alaskan congregation in Shishmaref. Located on an island not far from the land bridge once joining present day Russia and Alaska. The community of about six hundred still practices a very ancient and traditional way of life, even as the place it's called home for thousands of years has been increasingly eroded by environmental



changes related to global warming. Julia was ready to go and had her eye on a particular pair of mukluks—boots made out of seal or reindeer skin. But as it turned out, the Holy Spirit had other plans for us.

When this became clear, I figured I wouldn't hear much about Shishmaref again. I was wrong. Yesterday, I randomly learned the bishop-elect of the Greater Alaska Synod had served in Shishmaref up until the year before I was asked to do so. A few weeks prior I very unexpectedly found myself having lunch with Pastor Lisa Hackler. Recently relocated from Anchorage, she had served a Native Alaskan congregation which shared a facility with Central Lutheran where her husband Pastor

Jeff had served. At one point, Pastor Lisa was quickly able to correct a misunderstanding related to another unexpected contact with Shishmaref which over the years had surfaced for me. But even as Shishmaref came up, what Pastor Lisa and I talked about most was her interest in our associate pastor's position.

Pastor Lisa and I met just a day after the last edition of this newsletter featured words from me stating we had no prospects for our associate pastor position. This was true at the time I wrote it. But with the Holy Spirit blowing when and where the Spirit shall, a lot can change in a week and the Spirit sure does have a way of reminding us that none of our faith experiences are isolated events with no connection to a larger whole. In Pastor Lisa's case, the tapestry of experiences the Spirit regularly weaves into a larger whole shall be particularly useful to American Lutheran Church. Serving in Africa, Missouri, and Texas before Alaska, Pastor Lisa is a deeply experienced practitioner of congregational ministry who's done most of what there is to be done and who will therefore come ready to contribute to the health and vitality of our entire ministry. But above all, Pastor Lisa is invested in the furtherance of Jesus' new creation values and commitments-healthy people, healthy relationships, healthy communities, healthy whole. With building community and letting no one slip through the cracks so important for our future, this is just what we need and Pastor Lisa is very much touched and moved by our commitment to ministries of care and compassion. In her estimation, and I know exactly what she means, too few congregations are motivated by interpersonal care and love; instead unhelpfully looking for the nonexistent program or person who shall fix all that ails Lutherans these days. For Pastor Lisa and me, the basics of congregational ministry are as powerful and prolific as ever. Instead of trying to reinvent a wheel which has

been in existence for thousands of years, we just need to practice the basics of mission and ministry with passion and faith and interpersonal sensitivity.

In the coming days, you'll receive a letter inviting your presence at the special congregational meeting where extending a call to Pastor Lisa Hackler shall be considered. With the letter also furnishing basic information about who Pastor Lisa is as a person, the meeting itself will be held after the conclusion of the 9:30 service on Sunday, May 19th. During worship services on Saturday, May 11th and Sunday, May 12th, Pastor Lisa shall be present to give an in-person presentation about her pastoral identity and history much like the presentation I gave remotely during my call process. A meet and greet opportunity will follow the service and presentation on the 12th. Should the call vote be successful, and Call Committee, Congregational Council, and staff all very much look forward to working with Pastor Lisa, our prospective associate pastor would likely begin her responsibilities on Sunday, June 2nd.

CALL COMMITTEE UPDATE

On Thursday, April 25th, your ALC Call Committee submitted the name of Rev. Lisa Hackler to the ALC Council with the recommendation that Rev. Hackler be extended a call to become the Associate Pastor of American Lutheran Church of Sun City.

Rev. Hackler comes to us highly recommended from her most recent pastorate in the Alaska Synod. Pastor Lisa, as we will come to know her, was the pastor at the Alaska Native Lutheran Church in Anchorage, Alaska. Prior to her pastorate in Anchorage, Pastor Lisa served congregations in Texas and Missouri and as a missionary in Central Africa.

Pastor Lisa's warmth, openness, and enthusiasm for ministry in the Lutheran Church were immediately noticeable upon our first meeting. Even prior to that first meeting, the information we received from our Grand Canyon Synod introduced us to a pastor with extensive passion for and experience in visiting and engaging members in church and faith life. Her experiences working with Native Alaskans provided a whole new experience in social ministry and evangelism, experiences which will fuel her enthusiasm for our new Social Ministry and Evangelism Committees.

Pastor Lisa's compassion for and interest in working with seniors was highlighted in both the written introductory information we received and in the comments she made as she answered our many questions. Her enthusiasm for getting to know everyone and being certain that everyone feels that they are an important part of the congregation, regardless of their current stage in life, will be a major focus of her ministry, a goal that will most assuredly help ALC be a congregation where no one falls between the cracks. Bible studies and other small group activities are also among Pastor Lisa's passions, and while she will not be able to be involved in all of these ministerial activities during her first year, she is excited about their potential for building and maintaining a loving and meaningful church.

Your ALC Call Committee believes that Rev. Lisa Hackler will compliment and complete our ALC ministerial team. The committee unanimously recommends a "Yes" vote to extend a call to Rev. Hackler to be the Associate Pastor at American Lutheran Church of Sun City.

The Dance of the Trinity

The doctrine of the Holy Trinity, one God existing as three, co-equal persons, is a theological concept that attempts to explain the nature of God. The three creeds of the Church, Apostles', Nicene, and Athanasian, were all written to express our belief in God as a Trinity of persons. Throughout the history of Christian tradition, theologians have attempted to explain the doctrine of the Trinity, ranging from using simple imagery to extensive and elaborate narratives that delve into the depth of this fundamental, Christian doctrine. But the Trinity is a mystery of faith. And given the limitations of our human understanding, it does not matter how much we contemplate God as Trinity, or how extensively we attempt to thoroughly express the nature of a Trinitarian God. We can always explore this mystery further and deeper.

Over the centuries, the nature of the Trinity has been frequently described as a dance. The three persons of the Trinity, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, are engaged in a circle dance. The Trinity depicted in this way is a beautiful expression of the relationship between the three persons of the Trinity; a relationship that is not a top-down hierarchy, but a relationship of equals, bonded together in love, living and working together.

Our Christian worship tradition frequently invokes the Holy Trinity; from the first greeting at the beginning of our worship through the benediction at the conclusion. Our prayers are frequently written in a Trinitarian format, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We are baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Our prayer of Great Thanksgiving for communion contains Trinitarian elements. And the Trinity is frequently referenced in our many hymns.

This year, Trinity Sunday is celebrated on May 26. A hymn we will be singing that day is "Come, Join the Dance of Trinity." This text beautifully expands upon the idea of the persons of the Trinity engaged in a holy dance and we are invited to join them.

And thank you-the vibrant, singing congregation. We inspire each other to do our best and accept the great commission using the gifts so freely given to us.



Bus Update

Greetings ALC Congregation,

Over the past several weeks, our bus has been out of service for repairs, which has prompted conversations about the future of the ALC bus ministry. Factors considered were operating costs, the unreliability of an aging vehicle, the increasing maintenance costs involved, the difficulty finding drivers due to new regulations to obtain a CDL license, and the five financial goals already set for 2024 which have not yet been achieved. After great thought and consideration, the church council has made the difficult decision to sell the bus.

With that decision comes the issue of how we will provide transportation for a handful of our members who need rides to services and WNA. We would like to reignite our "Neighbors Helping Neighbors" ministry.

If you have a reliable vehicle and would be willing to assist one or two of your fellow members by giving them a ride to weekend services, please let our Resource Minister - Annette DeJesus know. Most of the members who ride the bus are within 5 miles of ALC. If fuel expenses are an issue ALC is willing to compensate each driver for their time and expenses.

If a former user of the bus prefers to hire their own transportation, ALC is also willing to reimburse that member for their expenses up to \$20 per round trip. Members must submit their receipts to DeNage in the office for reimbursement.

If anyone has any alternative ideas or solutions they would like to suggest and discuss we are open to other options.

Sun City Posse Services Available for YOU.

The Sun City Posse offers a variety of services to the community. Two services of interest for members of our congregation are highlighted below. Both are offered at no charge to Sun City residents. The only requirement is a telephone.

R.U.O.K. For those who live alone ...

This service provides a phone call to your home each and every day to ensure that you are not experiencing difficulties. If you answer and press a key on the phone, the system will assume you are OK. If you don't answer, the service calls again three times every 15 minutes. The Posse will then notify a public safety agency.

Funeral Watch Program

In order to provide peace of mind to the family, the Posse will provide a marked car and uniformed Posse member to protect the residence of the family while they are away for services. Once you contact the Posse, they will schedule a Posse member to be at your residence before you leave for the service.

THE YEAR IN REVIEW

This has been another productive year for ALC's Stephen Ministry program. Most noticeably we were able to conduct our "annual" Stephen Ministry training once again after missing last year. And that training has provided four new Stephen Ministers for our ALC roster. We were especially pleased to congratulate and welcome this group at our annual Stephen Ministry Banquet on March 23rd and then to be present and support them as they were formally commissioned at the 10:30 worship service on April 7th.

Stephen Ministers complete 50 hours of training prior to being commissioned, but that is just the beginning. We meet monthly, November through May, for continuing education and refresher training to help us be as prepared and ready to help our Care Receivers as we can be. This year we began our programming by taking the opportunity to learn of all the resources which are available to members of ALC through Annette DeJesus our Lutheran Social Services representative who has office hours here at ALC.

Topics for the succeeding months included loneliness, depression, and suicide. These are all conditions which are prevalent in our population and learning to recognize the symptoms and means of helping someone deal with them is essential to our mission.

Holy Communion and its role in Stephen Ministry provided another topic for in depth study this year, guiding us as we bring this means of grace to our Care Receivers.

As this year draws to a close, we are already planning next year's programming. Some of these topics will be of general interest and all topics will be announced in advance to the congregation. If you notice a topic which is of particular interest to you, we invite you to attend our presentations.

Stephen Ministry is a vital part of our Care Ministry at ALC. This ministry can only continue if new people join us on a regular basis. Please watch for information this Fall regarding how you might become part of our ministry outreach.

While we do not meet formally during the summer months, we continue to meet regularly with our Care Receivers because Stephen Ministry is "Christ Caring For People Through People".
