

Welcome to Wednesday Night Alive!

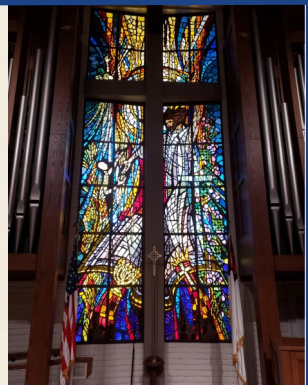
Wednesday Night Alive! has been an integral part of American Lutheran Church of Sun City for 30 years! The goal of WNA is to combine fellowship and outreach in a way that inspires, educates, and entertains that enriches our lives and strengthens our social connections.

The WNA season begins on the first Wednesday in November (November 5, 2025) with a special Gala kickoff program and continues weekly until the week before Holy Week (through March 25, 2026). Each WNA event consists of a program at 4:00 p.m. followed by a dinner in the Fellowship Hall at 5:00 p.m., and a program at 6:00 p.m. Most programs are held in the Sanctuary. During Advent and Lent, the 6:00 p.m. program is replaced by a church service. Attendance at the 4:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. programs is free and open to the public. 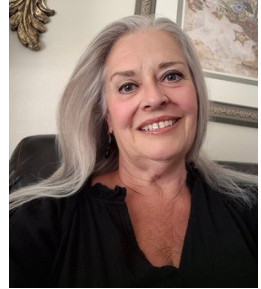


November 5

ALC Veteran's Day Celebration

4:00 PM: Veterans Day Program

Following the presentation of colors by the Luke AFB Honor Guard, Cmdr. Joel Lassman, USN (Ret) will share his life story.

Cmdr. Lassman's parents were Holocaust survivors that emigrated to the United States after WWII. He attended the Naval Academy and served in the US Navy, reaching the rank of Commander. The

program will conclude with an acknowledgement of all Veterans in attendance and then taps. Guests will be seated outside in the ALC Courtyard surrounded by flags.

6:00 PM: The West Valley Wind Ensemble: Kicking Off our "America at 250" Year of Celebration

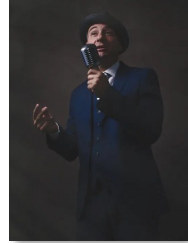

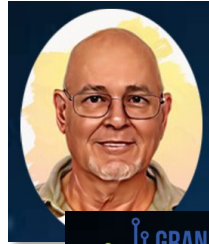

Join us for Dinner

Each week between programs at 5:00 p.m., a tasty and nutritious catered dinner is served in our Fellowship Hall. Each dinner includes an entree and sides such as a salad, vegetable, dinner roll, dessert, and coffee or tea. Tickets for the dinner must be purchased in advance by noon the prior Monday. The cost for the dinner is \$12, with one exception – the Gala dinner (November 5, 2025) costs \$15. On December 11, there is a free Christmas Potluck followed by a Hymn Sing in the Fellowship Hall. On Ash Wednesday there is a free Soup dinner (February 18, 2026), although reservations are still needed.

Tickets for each dinner may be purchased in person at the WNA table before each Church service, or in the church office on Thursdays, Fridays, and Mondays before noon. Cash or checks are the only form of payment accepted when purchasing tickets in person. Tickets may also be purchased online on the alcsuncity.org website with a credit card – the cutoff for web purchases is the previous Sunday night at midnight. Telephone reservations are not accepted and walk-ins for the dinner cannot be accommodated. And if you buy a ticket, and cannot make it, please consider this a gift to WNA! Tickets purchased cannot be used for a subsequent week's meal.
